IN RECOGNITION OF ATHERTON POLICE CANINE, QANCY

WHEREAS, Qancy z Třešňáku has actively served and protected the Town of Atherton for 6 years and is now almost 8 years old; and

WHEREAS, Qancy began her work in April 2014 after completing 160 hours of canine certified training. Qancy has been a great asset in assisting officers in their daily duties which require a strong set of physical and mental strength. Additionally, Qancy underwent 80 hours of training that enhanced her tracking skills for missing people and criminals. Qancy was also trained at S.K.I.D.D.S, a rigorous course that teaches canines effective approaches, stealth and tactics, safer criminal arrest techniques, along with synchronized team movement during live gunfire. Qancy also actively interacted with the community and made visits to schools along with attending events to maintain other skillsets that helped those around her; and

WHEREAS, Qancy and Canine Handler, Officer Krystal Pronske, routinely worked closely with each other, allowing them to create a strong partnership that has proven to be a valuable asset to the department and neighboring agencies. The effective dynamic between them has led to multiple cases where non-bite apprehensions occurred, an arrest for assault with a weapon, and aided with countless incidents that occurred in the communities nearby; and

WHEREAS, Though Qancy's mission is to protect the Atherton community, her duty was to ensure both her and Officer Pronske finished their shifts together. Qancy will continue to be an integral part of Atherton's Police Department history, further proving how K9 units are an important asset to law enforcement agencies.; and
